Call And Complain Now

Obama's Secretary of Labor, Hilda Solis, appears in a "We Can Help" public service announcement in which she states:

"You have the right to be paid fairly. ...it is a serious problem when workers in this country are not being paid every cent they earn. Remember, every worker in America has a right to be paid fairly, whether documented or not. So, call us. It is free and confidential, at 1-866-487-9243. We can help."

In other words, the Obama administration will work on behalf of illegal immigrants who complain they are being underpaid—but it won't do anything about deporting them or preventing them from entering the country by the millions.

I encourage *all* Americans to complain to their Senators and Congressmen about this action by the Obama administration. If illegal immigrants do not like how much they are getting paid, they can go back to where they came from. We should not be using tax dollars to help illegal immigrants get paid more.

In fact, I encourage *everyone* to call the toll-free number given by Solis and complain that they too are "not being paid every cent they earn." After all, the paychecks of all Americans reflect the deduction of federal income tax, Social Security tax, and Medicare tax—thus *no one* is being paid "every cent they earn!"

It is worth noting that the Federal Immigration and Nationality Act (Section 8 USC 1324) makes it illegal to assist illegal immigrants: "Any person who ...encourages or induces an alien to ...reside ...knowing or in reckless disregard of the fact that such ...residence is ...in violation of law, shall be punished as provided ...for each alien in respect to whom such a violation occurs ...fined under title 18 ... imprisoned not more than 5 years, or both."

Section 274 felonies under the federal Immigration and Nationality Act, INA 274A(a)(1)(A):

"A person (including a group of persons, business, organization, or local government) commits a federal felony when she or he: assists an alien s/he should reasonably know is illegally in the U.S. or who lacks employment authorization, by transporting, sheltering, or assisting him or her to obtain employment, or encourages that alien to remain in the U.S. by referring him or her to an employer or by acting as employer or agent for an employer in any way, or knowingly assists illegal aliens due to personal convictions."

By offering illegal immigrants assistance in matters of pay, Secretary of Labor Soils is therefore violating federal law.
