

Dear Fox News:

Does no one read the U.S. Constitution? Fox reporter Carl Cameron has nonchalantly noted that Louisiana Governor Bobby Jindal could be one of the Republicans running for president in 2012. But Jindal's parents were both born in India. He cannot be considered a natural born citizen eligible to serve as president *unless* his parents *both* became naturalized U.S. citizens *before* he was born. I believe that is not the case; they were in the United States on student visas and were not yet U.S. citizens. Jindal is therefore not a natural born citizen—which requires that one be born on U.S. soil to two U.S. citizen parents—and cannot serve as President of the United States. For the same reason Obama is not eligible to serve as president, because his father (assuming his father was Barack Hussein Obama, Sr., which is subject to question) was *not* a U.S. citizen.

While I have no doubt that Jindal would be a better president than Obama, that does not mean I am willing to ignore the Constitution to see that happen. The Constitution has been ignored enough over the last 150 years. The time has come for that abuse to end, and to start reversing it.

Will the media ever make an issue of Jindal's status? Will he be given a pass because addressing the issue will lead to more Americans questioning Obama's eligibility to serve? Or have members of the mainstream media been ordered to stay away from the topic ever since Obama was "selected" as the 2008 Democrat candidate?

Either Carl Cameron does not know the U.S. Constitution, or he received the same "keep your mouth shut" memorandum as did Shepard Smith, Bill O'Reilly, Sean Hannity, Glenn Beck, et al. What a shame that there is not one network with the courage to defend the U.S. Constitution or to ask the questions that most Americans expect of reporters.

Yes, I sometimes watch Fox... but only because it is "the lesser of many network evils." At some point I will have to turn off Fox as well... and that may come soon.
