Independence Day

Proem

been almost completely destroyed by Barack Hussein Obama and Mr. judicial narcissist John Roberts.

In 1893, the thirty-three-year-old Katharine Lee Bates (1859-1929), professor of English at Wellesley College, took a train journey from Boston, Massachusetts to Colorado Springs, Colorado. There she was engaged to teach a short summer college course at Colorado College. During the journey she saw several natural sites and man-made beautiful constructions that inspired her to write a poem: the vastness of the Mid-West, the Great Plains, Pikes Peak, and the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago with its alabaster buildings that gave the city the nickname of White City.

Originally, Katherine Lee Bates' poem was titled *Pikes Peak*. The reason is that when she was on that pinnacle the words began to flow through her mind. She started to memorize them and when she returned to the Antlers Hotel, she wrote them down on paper in their final form. Some amended versions appeared in 1904 and 1913.

The poem's first publication was in *The Congregationalist*, the Fourth of July Edition, in 1895. The original use was as an Independence Day poem. Herein the poem received the title *America*. The music to *America*, the Beautiful was composed by Samuel Augustus Ward (1807-1903), the church organist and choirmaster of Grace Episcopal Church in Newark, New Jersey. On a summer day in 1882, Samuel Augustus Bates and his friend Harry Martin had taken some leisure time and gone to Coney Island. Returning back to New York City on a ferry boat, the melody kept running through Ward's mind. Intent on not forgetting it, he asked his friend if he

could jot down the notes on his shirt cuff. He originally composed the tune for the Church hymn *O Mother Dear, Jerusalem*. Samuel Bates re-titled the hymn *Materna*. It remained this hymn until 1910, when Katherine Lee Bates' poem and Samuel Augustus Ward's music were combined and published. At this time the title became *America, the Beautiful*.³ Samuel Augustus Ward and Katherine Lee Bates never met. Ward died in 1903 and Bates outlived him by twenty-six years

Throughout the past three to four generations there have been attempts to make America, the Beautiful the legal national hymn of the United States of America in place of *The Star Spangled Banner*, particularly during the democratic administration of John F. Kennedy (1917-1963; 1961-1963). (The reader can think of President Kennedy what s/he wants, yet it should remain in the reader's mind that it surely is interesting how Democrats want to change and re-write the meaning of American history!) The arguments for *America, the Beautiful* are claims that it is easier to sing, it has a better melody, musical arrangements are easier, and the music is easily recognized by everyone. Another criticism of The Star Spangled Banner is that it has too much war imagery. Of course, the national anthem has war imagery. It is a fact of the history of the struggle for independence that the Republic of the United States of America had to fight and sacrifice patriotic lives to gain its freedom from Great Britain in the American Revolutionary War and in the War of 1812. It was during this latter war that Francis Scott Key, an American poet, lawyer, and district attorney composed the lyrics to The Star Spangled Banner when he was forced to

watch the British ships bombard Fort McHenry during the Battle of Baltimore on the night of 13-14 September, 1814.
