## **LEFTISM IS FASCISM**

\*\*\*

Leftism is a political ideology that is the opposite of conservatism. Other well-known terms for leftism are: communism, liberalism, on the left, political radicalism, political revolutionism, progressivism, socialism, and believe it or not, fascism.

Anti-Americanism always originates with the political Left. The political Left is always pro-Islam. The political Left always peaks of Islam and the Muslim Brotherhood as movements of human progress. Indeed, the Left has become so much like Islam that it considers itself the source of truth. Both Islam and the Left never make mistakes. Both never apologize for their historical wrongs. Neither the Left nor Islam can issue a *mea culpa* because both the Left and Islam see their being as infallible. Both Islam and the Left demand that the world must be remade in their images. Both treat their followers as being stupid. They never allow different opinions. Both are autocratic totalitarianisms.


In his magnificent work *The Road to Serfdom*, Friedrich Hayek wrote,

“It is not only the principles of Adam Smith and Hume and Locke and Milton which are being abandoned. It is the bedrock of the civilization developed by the Greeks and the Romans and Christianity. Meaning, the western civilization. What is being relinquished is not only the liberalism of the 18th and 19th centuries, that is the liberalism which completed that civilization,” “It is the individualism which, thanks to Erasmus of Rotterdam and Montaigne and Cicero and Tacitus and Pericles and Thucydides, that western civilization has inherited. In other words, the concept itself of individualism which through the teachings imparted to us by the philosophers of classical antiquity then of Christianity then of Renaissance then of the Enlightenment have made us what we are. Socialism is based on

collectivism. And anyone who denies individualism denies western civilization.”<sup>1</sup>

The Leftists and Islamists deny Individualism and Western civilization so much that they in their dirty collectiveness barf together against everything that is ethical, indeed everything that is moral.

The statement that if one goes far enough to the political left one will come out on the political right and vice-versa is a rendition of the continuance of the horseshoe thesis in political theory postulated by the French philosopher Jean-Pierre Faye (1925-20XX) in his book *Le Siècle des ideologies*.<sup>2</sup> It is presented in the following image:



*Horseshoe theorists argue that the [extreme left](#) and the [extreme right](#) are closer to each other than either is to the political center.*

However, neither the rendition above or the image and the explanation of the image are correct. The more exact, logical continuance is that being fascist is the same as being leftist. If a leftist faces reality, the leftist encounters the

mirror image of fascism. If the fascist faces reality, the fascist encounters the mirror image of leftism.

The truth is that fascism, of which Hitler's National Socialism<sup>3</sup> is an offshoot, is communist and communism is fascist/National Socialist, i.e., the (extreme) political left **is** the (extreme) political right and vice-versa.

In the United States of America, the traditional political view of the Left is a Big Government what will solve all of the problems of the citizens; indeed, even illegal non-citizens. This is the same political view of fascism: a gargantuan government. It is a state religion that "assumes the organic unity of the body politic and longs for a national leader attuned to the will of the people (who have been propagandized and brainwashed into wanting a certain will that has been dictated to them). It is totalitarian in that it views everything as political and holds that any action by the state is justified to achieve the common good. It takes responsibility for all aspects of life, including our health and well-being, and seeks to impose the uniformity of thought and action, whether by force or through regulation and social pressure. Everything, including the economy and religion, must be aligned with its objectives. Any rival identity is part of the 'problem' and therefore defined as the enemy. ... Contemporary American liberalism embodies all of these aspects of fascism."<sup>4</sup> This is totally contradictory to the opposite freedom symbolized by the statement *That government is best which governs least*.

The terms *political left* and *political right* have their origins in the French Revolution of 1789. Members of the French National Assembly who supported the monarchy sat on the right side of the president of the French National Assembly and those who supported the revolution sat on the left side of the president of the French National Assembly. In reality, the French Monarchists and the French Radicals were not at opposite ends of the political spectrum as historians would like us to believe. They were both on the same side with different approaches concerning how France was to be governed. The

Monarchists wanted to place all power in one individual. The radicals wanted to invest all power in one big government oligarchy. The Monarchists and the Radicals were simply rival groups in the leftist political bloc.

The governing system of the political left is communism (collectivism, socialism), also called Marxism, and in its general use means "a theory or system of social organization in which all property is owned by the community and each person contributes and receives according to their ability and needs." *The Oxford Dictionary* explains communism as that system "established by the Bolsheviks after the Russian Revolution of 1917, and it has generally been understood in terms of the system practised by the former Soviet Union and its allies in eastern Europe, in China since 1949, and in some developing countries such as Cuba, Vietnam, and North Korea. In this form of communism, it was held that the state would wither away after the overthrow of the capitalist system. In practice, however, the state grew to control all aspects of communist society. Communism in eastern Europe collapsed in the late 1980s and early 1990s against a background of failure to meet people's economic expectations, a shift to more democracy in political life, and increasing nationalism such as that which led to the break-up of the Soviet Union."<sup>5</sup>

The definition of the governing system of the political right has come to mean fascism/National socialism (conservatism, rightism) and in its general use means "extreme right-wing, authoritarian, or intolerant views or practices." *The Oxford Dictionary* explains fascism as follows: the "totalitarian, right-wing, nationalist regime of Mussolini in Italy (1922–43); the regimes of the Nazis in Germany and Franco in Spain were also Fascist. Fascism tends to include a belief in the supremacy of one national or ethnic group, a contempt for democracy, an insistence on obedience to a powerful leader, and a strong demagogic approach."<sup>6</sup>

Often being associated with liberals, the welfare state, and anti-free market, the term left-wing has historically been applied to so-called extreme movements including communism, socialism, and anarchism.<sup>7</sup>

Often being associated with conservatives, monarchists, and traditionalists, the term right-wing has historically been applied to so-called extreme movements including fascists, nationalist-socialists, and racialists.<sup>8</sup>

These positions of the so-called political left (communism, left-wing) and the so-called political right (fascism/National Socialism, right-wing) were the accepted positions of the general public and academics throughout the last seventy years of the twentieth century and have carried over into the twenty-first century. The intent was then to deceive and still is to deceive.

It is exactly at this presentation of the definitions juncture that the fluidity of what fascism is and to which political pole it belongs becomes muddied, intentionally muddied. It was muddied at its inception, stayed muddied throughout the remainder of the twentieth century and to this day is still muddied in the first fifteen years of the twenty-first century. As long as leftists are intellectually incapable of comprehending that fascism is leftism, the clarity of what fascism is will remain muddy.

The instigator of the formulation of the deception intended to deceive the general public that has been followed by Leftists ever since was Joseph Stalin (1879-1953). Josef Stalin contemplated communism as a world movement. Benito Mussolini (1883-1945) and Adolf Hitler (1889-1945) envisioned their other-named forms of communism as national movements that would turn into international political movements which would eventually conquer the world.

Joseph Stalin (1879-1953, Leader of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union and dictator of the USSR 1924-1953) accepted the view that social democracy was a twin brother of fascism; both depended on each other. This was recognized by the world communist movement.<sup>9</sup> When Stalin gained control of political power in The Soviet Union after the death of Lenin (Vladimir Ilyich Ulyanov, 1870-1924), Stalin's policy on Soviet

social economics shifted, thus intensifying class struggle within the Soviet Union. The peasants, particularly the wealthy kulacks (independent farmers) were perceived as enemies of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union. They were seen as wreckers and traitors of the system. This was carried over into international communism and as a result Stalin denounced social democrats and dissidents. He termed them fascists.

Under the leadership of the German Chancellor Hermann Müller (1876-1931, Chancellor 1920, 1928-1930) , the Social Democratic Party (SPD) of Germany agreed with the emerging anti-communist parties that "red equals brown."<sup>10</sup> The SPD passed repressive legislation against the Communists and upon the shooting of Communist demonstrators in Berlin on May 1, 1929, the Communists were convinced that Social Democrats were "Social Fascists."<sup>11</sup> Nevertheless, in 1931, the Communist Party of Germany (KPD) labeled the NSDAP (Nationalsozialistische Deutsche Arbeiterpartei) "working people's comrades." These two groups formally united and attempted to defeat the SPD government in an ensuing election, denying any differences between Nazism and Social Democracy.<sup>12</sup>

After the Nazis came to power in Germany, the KPD was outlawed and thousands of its members were arrested and sent to concentration camps. Joseph Stalin then abandoned all connections with social fascism.

In spite of the fact that Benito Mussolini once said that Joseph Stalin was "his very best student,"<sup>13</sup> Joseph Stalin viewed Benito Mussolini and Adolf Hitler as well, as deviators from his form of communist ideology as a world movement. Stalin labelled them rightist reactionaries. The naming was intentional. Thus, the groups of the political left and the political right came into being because Stalin's nomenclature separated them from their common origin. The division

became history. After World War II it was vogue to consider them as separate, political ideologies. However, in fact they were both the same: communism was fascism/National Socialism and fascism/National Socialism was communism. This original reality has been lost in the historical usages and transitions of the terms.<sup>14</sup> Yet, the truth remains that the political left is fascism and fascism is the political left.

Jim, O'Neill, essayist and regular contributor to the *Canada Free Press*, has written very clear essays explaining the rationale behind leftism and fascism: that there is no difference between fascism and leftism.<sup>15</sup>

The Italian journalist Oriana Fallaci (1929-2006) once described fascism and communism as two soccer teams opposing each other, yet in fact playing for the same side.<sup>16</sup>

Playing for the same side can also be visualized by using the image of the Möbius band, a non-orientable, ruled surface with only one side and only one boundary. Anyone can make a Möbius band by taking a paper strip, giving it a half-twist, and then joining the ends of the strip to form a loop. The size of the Möbius band for this presentation is irrelevant. It is important that the reader keep in mind that the Möbius band is only one strip with only one side that allows two separate items to come together on the same plane.


In this exercise consider the Möbius band to be the political spectrum and the designates **leftism** and **fascism** to be ideologies in that spectrum. Fascism is not right wing! Fascism is left wing! Since Stalin's designation of the nomenclature, the left has successfully labelled conservatism as being fascist to take attention away from their own political sorcery.
