There are twenty-six personalities in this issue of *Renowned Historical Voices Comment on Barack Hussein Obama*. The time span is from the fifteenth century to the end of the sixteenth century. - *On Quean Michelle*: All ye that be lovers call unto your remembrance the month of May, like as did *Quean Michelle*, for whom I make here a little mention, that while she lived she was a true lover, and therefore she *always* had a good end.⁸
- *On Obama and his minions*: Such a fellowship of *evil persons* shall never be together in no company.⁹
- *American Patriots to Obama*: We shall curse you with book and bell and candle.¹⁰
- *Obama on Donald Young*: Through this man and me hath all these trials been wrought, and the death of the most noblest *gay* knights of the world; for through our love that we have loved together is my most noble *Donald* slain.¹¹

For as well as I have loved thee, mine heart will not serve me to see thee, for through thee and me is the flower of *offspring* destroyed.¹²

Thou were the meekest man and the gentlest that ever ate in hall among *gays*. And thou were the sternest *gay* knight to thy mortal foe that ever put spear in the *rear*.¹³

3. François Villon (1431. - c.1465)

François Villon was a French poet, a thief, and a vagabond. His renown rests upon his *Testaments* and his *Ballade des Pendus*, both written while in prison. The question *Mais où sont les neiges d'antan?* (*But where are the snows of yesteryear?*), from the *Ballade des dames du temps jadis*, is one of the most famous lines of French poetry and translated secular poetry in the English language.

- *Obama on being impeached*: Ah God! Had I but *really* studied *American Constitutional Law* in the days of my foolish youth.¹⁴

4. Aldus Manutius (1449-1515)

Aldus Pius Manutius (Aldo Manuzio and sometimes called Aldus Manutius, the Elder) was an Italian humanist and printer-publisher. He founded the Aldine Press at Venice. He invented italic type, established the use of the semicolon, and introduced inexpensive books in small formats bound in vellum, the forerunners of modern paperbacks.

- *Obama on his politics*: Talk of nothing but *golf*, and dispatch that *ball* quickly.¹⁷

5. Christopher Columbus (1451 – 1506)

Christopher Columbus, explorer, colonizer, and navigator, was born in the Republic of Genoa. He was in the service of the Catholic monarchs of Spain. Columbus completed four voyages across the Atlantic Ocean. These voyages, and the establishment of permanent settlements on the island of Hispaniola, started the Spanish and European colonization of the New World.

- On Obama's tenure: Here the people could stand it no longer and complained of the long *years*; but the *dictator* cheered them as best he could, holding out good hope of the advantages they would have. He added that it was useless to complain, he had come ..., and so had to continue it until he *relieved* them, with the help of *Satan*.¹⁸

Americans have not a hair on *them* that is not white, and *their bodies are* infirm and exhausted. All that was left to *them and their brothers and sisters* has been taken away and sold, even to the *cloaks* that *they* wore, without hearing or trial, to *your and my great honor*.²²

6. Leonardo da Vinci (1452 – 1519)

Leonardo di ser Piero da Vinci was an Italian Renaissance polymath: anatomist, architect, botanist, cartographer, engineer, geologist, inventor, mathematician, musician, painter, scientist, sculptor, and writer. He was a genius figure of the Renaissance, the archetype of what cultural historians name the Renaissance Man. His curiosity was unquenchable, his imagination unparalleled. Leonardo di ser Piero da Vinci is probably the most talented person who has ever lived.

- As a well-spent day brings happy sleep, so life well used brings happy death.²³
Obama will not have a happy death.
- Whosoever in discussion adduces authority uses not intellect ...²⁴
- Iron rusts from disuse; stagnant water loses its purity and in cold weather becomes frozen; even so does inaction sap the vigor of the mind.²⁵ *Obama, stop playing golf!*
- *Obama on saving himself from criticism:* Savage is he who saves himself.²⁶
- *To American patriots on election day:* It is easier to resist at the beginning than at the end.²⁷
- *Obama* will never devise a *policy* more beautiful, more simple or more direct than does nature *in the Constitution for the United States of America*, because in her *natural laws* nothing is lacking, and nothing is superfluous.²⁸
- O speculators about *Obama's genius*, how many vain chimeras have you created in the like quest? Go and take your place with the *failed* seekers after gold.²⁹

- *An American Patriot: The Founding Fathers created me and Obama destroyed me.*³⁰

7. Amerigo Vespucci (1454-1512)

Amerigo Vespucci was an Italian cartographer, explorer, navigator, and financier. The Americas receive their appellation from the feminized Latin version of his first name. Between 1499 and 1502 Vespucci, at the invitation of Manuel of Portugal made several voyages to the east coast of South America. Vespucci also sailed to the Americas for Spain. In 1508, he received the position Chief Navigator of Spain (*piloto mayor de Indias*) responsible for the navigation of Spanish trips to the Indies.

- *America before its destruction by Obama: Those new regions [America] which we found and explored with the fleet we may rightly call a New World a continent more densely peopled and abounding in animals than our Europe or Asia or Africa; and, in addition, a climate milder than in any other region known to us.*³¹

8. Sebastian Brant (c.1458-1521)

Sebastian Brant (Brandt) was an Alsatian (France) humanist and satirist. He is best known for his satire *Das Narrenschiff (The Ship of Fools)*.

- *Obama's rationale for his conduct: The world wants to be deceived.*³²

9. John Skelton (c.1460-1529)

John Skelton (John Shelton) was an English poet. He is considered the chronicler of customs and behaviors of the renaissance court of the English Tudors. Literary

historians place him, his critical commentary and satirical prowess with that of John Dryden, Jonathan Swift, and Alexander Pope.

- *The truth to Obama: I say, thou mad March hare.*³³
- *Obama ruleth all the roost.*³⁴
- *Obama is: The wolf from the door.*³⁵
- *On Obama's greed: Old proverb says, That bird is not honest / That filleth his own nest.*³⁶
- *On Obama's rationale for his politics: Vengeance I ask and cry, / By way of exclamation, / On the whole nation / Of cats wild and tame: / God send them sorrow and shame!*³⁷
- *On Michelle: Merry Michelle, / As midsummer flower, / Gentle as falcon / Or hawk of the tower.*³⁸

10. Giovanni Pico della Mirandola (1463-1494)

Count Giovanni Pico della Mirandola was an Italian Renaissance philosopher. In 1486, at the age of 23, he challenged all intellects of his time to debate him on his propositions that defended 900 theses on magic, natural philosophy, philosophy, and religion. The result was the Manifesto of the Renaissance, the *Oration on the Dignity of Man*, which is hailed as one of the most important texts, if not the most important text of Renaissance humanism.

- *On the free person in America before the coming of the destroyer of freedom Barack Hussein Obama:*
We have made thee neither of heaven nor of earth, neither mortal nor immortal, so that with freedom of choice and with honor, as though the maker and molder of thyself, thou mayest fashion thyself in whatever shape thou shalt prefer. Thou shalt have the power to degenerate into –the lower

Obama forms of life, which are brutish. Thou shalt have the power, out of thy soul's judgment, to be reborn into the highest forms, which are divine.³⁹

11. William Dunbar (c.1465 - c.1530)

William Dunbar was a Scottish maker (bard) closely associated with the court of King James IV of Scotland. His works are in Scots and contain great variations in themes and literary styles that sometimes attempt to complement the themes.

- *An American Patriot's feelings under Obama:* I that in heill wes and gladnes
Am trublit now with gret seiknes
And feblit with infermite:
Timor Mortis conturbat me.⁴⁰

- *American Patriots on the Obama regime:* Our plesance here is all vain glory,
This false world is but transitory.⁴¹

11. Desiderius Erasmus (c.1465 - 1536)

Desiderius Erasmus Roterodamus is also known as Erasmus of Rotterdam. He was a Catholic priest, Renaissance humanist, social critic, educator, and theologian, who wrote in pure Latin and Greek, making Latin and Greek translations of the New Testament. He proposed religious toleration and raised questions that influenced the Protestant Reformation and Catholic Counter-Reformation. He is also famous for *The Praise of Folly*, *Handbook of a Christian Knight*, *On Civility in Children*, *Copi: Foundations of the Abundant Style*, *Julius Exclusus*, as well as many other works.

- In the country of the blind the one-eyed man is king. *The American electorate is blind and Obama is a double king!*⁴²

- *American Patriots on Obama and his Obots*: They may attack *us* with an army of six hundred calls of racism; and if *we* do not recant, they will proclaim us ... heretics.⁴³

12. Niccolò Machiavelli (1469-1527)

Niccolò di Bernardo dei Machiavelli was an Italian civil servant, diplomat, historian, humanist, playwright, poet, and song writer and (political) philosopher, who lived in the Florentine during the Renaissance. He is considered the founder of modern political science. From 1498 to 1512, Niccolò Machiavelli was Secretary to the Second Chancery of the Republic of Florence, the time when the Medici were not in political power. After the Medici had recovered power and he no longer held a position of responsibility, he wrote his masterpiece, *The Prince*.

- *On taking back American freedoms from Obama*: There is nothing more difficult to take in hand, more perilous to conduct, or more uncertain in its success, than to take the lead in the introduction of a new order of things.⁴⁴
- *Obama's rationale for his political existence*: Since love and fear can hardly exist together, if we must choose between them, it is far safer to be feared than loved.⁴⁵
- *On Obama's destruction of America's defense*: The chief foundations of all states, new as well as old or composite, are good laws and good arms; and as there cannot be good laws where the state is not well armed, it follows that where they are well armed they have good laws.⁴⁶
- *On Obama's war on America*: A prince should therefore have no other aim or thought, nor take up any other thing for his study, but war and its organization and discipline, for that is the only art that is necessary to one who commands.
- *On Obama arming his regime with hate*: Among other evils which being unarmed brings you, it causes you to be despised.⁴⁷

- *On Obama's self-destruction*: Many have imagined republics and principalities which have never been seen or known to exist in reality; for how we live is so far removed from how we ought to live, that he who abandons what is done for what ought to be done, will rather bring about his own ruin than his preservation.⁴⁸
- *On Obamas political raison d'être*: A prince being thus obliged to know well how to act as a beast must imitate the fox and the lion, for the lion cannot protect himself from traps, and the fox cannot defend himself from wolves. One must therefore be a fox to recognize traps, and a lion to frighten wolves.⁴⁹
- *On the opposite of Obama's politics*: When neither their property nor their honor is touched, the majority of men live content.⁵⁰
- *Obama is of the third intellect*: There are three classes of intellects: one which comprehends by itself; another which appreciates what others comprehend; and a third which neither comprehends by itself nor by the showing of others; the first is the most excellent, the second is good, the third is useless.⁵¹
- *On Obama's subsurface denial of the truth (from others)*: There is no other way of guarding oneself against flattery than by letting men understand that they will not offend you by speaking the truth; but when everyone can tell you the truth, you lose their respect.⁵²
- *Advice to Americans on trusting in God*: God is not willing to do everything, and thus take away our free will and that share of glory which belongs to us.⁵³
- *On Obama's hope and change*: Whoever desires to found a state and give it laws, must start with assuming that all men are bad and ever ready to display their vicious nature, whenever they may find occasion for it.⁵⁴
- *On Obama's undertaking absolute government control of everything in society*: The people resemble a wild beast, which, naturally fierce and accustomed to live in the woods, has been brought up, as it were, in a prison and in servitude, and having by accident got its liberty, not being accustomed to

search for its food, and not knowing where to conceal itself, easily becomes the prey of the first who seeks to incarcerate it again.⁵⁵

- *On Obama's readiness to kill American Patriots:* He who establishes a tyranny and does not kill Brutus, and he who establishes a democratic regime and does not kill the sons of Brutus, will not last long.⁵⁶

13. Charles VIII (1470-1498)

Charles VIII, the Affable, was King of France from 1483 to 1498. A member of the House of Valois, he began a long series of Italian wars that continued into the first half of the sixteenth century. Charles VIII retreated from Italy in 1496. In 1498, while on his way to watch a game of real tennis (*jeu de paume*) in Amboise, he struck his head on the lintel of a door. Upon returning from the game, he fell into a coma, and died nine hours later.

- *Obama on his governing by executive orders:* This is *my* gracious will.⁵⁷

14. Nicholas Copernicus (1473-1543)

Nicolaus Copernicus was a Renaissance astronomer. He was the first person to describe a comprehensive heliocentric cosmology thus displacing the Earth from the center of the universe. His book, *De revolutionibus orbium coelestium* (*On the Revolutions of the Celestial Spheres*), 1543, is the beginning of modern astronomy and the defining manifestation that initiated the scientific revolution.

- *On the proper place for Obama:* Finally we shall place *Obama* himself at the center of *Hades*. All this is suggested by the systematic procession of events and the *evil* harmony of the whole *narcissist*,⁵⁸

15. Ludovico Ariosto (1474-1533)

Ludovico Ariosto was an Italian poet who is best known as the author of the Italian romance epic poem *Orlando Furioso* (1516). The poem is a continuation of *Orlando Innamorato*, by Matteo Maria Boiardo. *Orlando Furioso* describes the adventures of Charlemagne, Orlando, and the Franks in their battle against the Saracens. The poem is composed in the *ottava rima* rhyme scheme and with narrative commentary accompanying the verses. There are many side plots.

- *On the birth of Obama*: Nature made him, and then broke the mold.⁵⁹

16. Michelangelo [Buonarroti] (1475-1564)

Michelangelo di Lodovico Buonarroti Simoni is known as Michelangelo. He was an Italian Renaissance architect, engineer, painter, poet, and sculptor, who greatly influenced on the development of Western art and architecture. Showing expert versatility in his disciplines, Michelangelo, along with Leonardo da Vinci, is considered the archetype of the Renaissance Man.

- *On Obama's love for Reggie*: The power of one fair face makes my love sublime, for it has weaned my heart from low desires.⁶⁰ I live and love in *Satan's* peculiar light.⁶¹

17. Sir Thomas More (1478- 1535)

Sir Thomas More is known by Catholics as Saint Thomas More. He was an English author, lawyer, Renaissance humanist, social philosopher, and statesman. An important councilor to Henry VIII of England and Lord Chancellor from October 1529 to 16 May 1532, he was opposed to the Protestant Reformation and decisively

against Martin Luther and William Tyndale. Roman Catholics commemorate him as a *Reformation martyr*. Sir Thomas More refused to take an oath in support of Henry VIII. He refused to consent to Henry VIII's marriage annulment from Catherine. In his book *Utopia* (1516), More described the perfect political system of an ideal and imaginary island nation.

- *On Obama's view of socialist utopia: Obama* wonders much to hear that gold, which in itself is so useless a thing, should be everywhere so much esteemed, that even men for whom it was made, and by whom it has its value, should yet be thought of less value than it is.⁶²
- *On Obama's socialist utopian view of law: They have excess lawyers among them, for they consider them as a sort of people whose profession it is to disguise matters.*⁶³
- *On the folly of obots: Obama* by a goodly similitude declareth, why wise men refrain to meddle in the commonwealth. For when they see the people swarm into the streets, and daily wet to the skin with rain, and yet cannot persuade them to go out of the rain, they do keep themselves within their houses, seeing they cannot remedy the folly of the people.⁶⁴
- *On Obama having others pay his way: A little wanton money, which burned out the bottom of his purse.*⁶⁵
- *On electing an obot: This is a fair tale of a tub told of his election.*⁶⁶
- *On Obama desiring a memorial for himself: For men use, if they have an evil turn, to write it in marble: and whoso doth us a good turn we write it in dust.*⁶⁷
- *On Obama's use of supporters: See me safe up, and for my coming down let me shift for myself.*⁶⁸
- *On Obama's desecration of the US Constitution: This hath not offended the king.*⁶⁹

18. Robert Whittinton (c.1480-1530)

Robert Whittinton (Whittington) was an English grammarian and pupil of the grammarian John Stanbridge. In 1532, under the title of *A Little Book of Good Manners for Children*, he published the first English translation of Erasmus of Rotterdam's treatise on the moral and practical education of children, *De civilitate morum puerilium* (1530).

- The *American Patriot* is a *person* of angel's wit and singular learning; I know not his *comparison*. For where is the *person* of that gentleness, lowliness and affability? And as time requireth, a *person* of marvelous mirth and pastimes; and sometimes of as sad a gravity; a *person* for all seasons.⁷⁰

19. Martin Luther (1483-1546)

Martin Luther was a German monk, priest, professor of theology, and the prime philosopher of the Protestant Reformation. He vehemently disputed that sinners could buy freedom from God's punishment. This resulted in his confrontation with Johann Tetzel who sold indulgences for the Pope. This religious disagreement was placed in writing with Luther's *Ninety-Five Theses* in 1517. Pope Leo X in 1520 and the Holy Roman Emperor Charles V at the Diet of Worms in 1521 ordered Luther to retract his standpoints. Luther refused. He was excommunicated by the pope and condemned as an outlaw by the Holy Roman Emperor.

- *On Obama's destruction of America*: If it were an art to overcome success with fire, the obots would be the most learned doctors on earth.⁷¹
- *An American Patriot protesting against Obama*: Here I stand; I can do no other. God help me. Amen!⁷²
- *On Obama, obots, and the Occupy Movement*: The mad mob does not ask how

- *On the importance of truth:* Superstition, idolatry, and hypocrisy have ample wages, but truth goes a-begging.⁷⁴
- *On Islam:* For where God built a church, there the Devil builds a mosque. ... Thus is the Devil ever God's ape.⁷⁵
- *On obots:* The *obots* are the greatest blasphemy of God, and the highest idolatry upon earth, an abomination the likes of which has never been in Christendom since the time of the Apostles.⁷⁶
- *Obama on being serviced by a male body servant:* There is no more lovely, friendly and charming relationship, communion or company⁷⁷

23. Saint Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556)

Ignatius of Loyola was a Spanish knight from a Basque noble family, a hermit and priest since 1537. He was the theologian who founded the Jesuits (Society of Jesus (Jesuits)) and was the organization's first Superior General. Ignatius was an important leader of the Counter-Reformation. His service to the Roman Catholic Church was undertaken by total obedience to the Catholic Church's hierarchy and authority.

Díaz was rewarded for his service with the appointment to the governorship of Santiago de los Caballeros, present-day Antigua Guatemala.

- *Thought on patriotism:* To me it appears that the names of *true patriots* be written in letters of gold, who died so cruel a death, for the service of their *country*, to give light to those who were in darkness, and to procure wealth which all men desire.⁸⁴

25. Philippus Aureolus Paracelsus (c. 1493-1541)

Paracelsus (Philippus Aureolus Theophrastus Bombastus von Hohenheim) was a German-Swiss Renaissance alchemist, astrologer, botanist, occultist, and physician.
